Services: In response to the need for expanded and enhanced trauma-informed and trauma-focused treatment for children and their families in Montgomery County, CCTC has expanded several of their programs into Montgomery County: Trauma Services, Family-Based Services, Outpatient Services, and Blended Case Management. The Trauma Services Program provides specialized traumafocused treatment to children ages 18 months - 18 years who have recently witnessed or experienced a traumatic event or who have been the victim of sexual abuse/assault.
