**Services:** In response to the need for expanded and enhanced trauma-informed and trauma-focused treatment for children and their families in Montgomery County, CCTC has expanded several of their programs into Montgomery County: Trauma Services, Family-Based Services, Outpatient Services, and Blended Case Management. The Trauma Services Program provides specialized trauma-focused treatment to children ages 18 months – 18 years who have recently witnessed or experienced a traumatic event or who have been the victim of sexual abuse/assault. The Family Based Program offers team-delivered, short-term intensive services in the home and community. This specialized program enables families to care for children with emotional and behavioral health challenges, thus reducing the need for out-of-home placement. This Outpatient Program offers a range of interventions that allow children and their families to learn ways to manage their behavior, understand their emotions, and more effectively communicate in their home, school, and community. The Blended Case Management Program works intensively with families to connect them to various resources within their community.
